

In the north, the TransCanada Hwy #1 follows the route of the Canadian Pacific Railway through four of Canada's National Parks, connecting Calgary with Vancouver and the coast.

A less travelled southern route, Hwy #3, serves travellers from southern Alberta, the southern Okanagan Valley and Vancouver. Ports of entry on the Canada/ US border allow access from Spokane, Washington; Coeur d'Alene, Idaho; Kalispell, Montana & points south.

#### NATIONAL PARKS

#### YOHO NATIONAL PARK


The word Yoho is a Cree expression of awe - the perfect description for this stunning 1,313 sq kilometre (505 sq mi) national park with its 28 mountain peaks which reach more than 3,000 metres towards the sky.

- Heritage Attractions the Spiral Tunnels, which were cut through the parks mountains to make way for the railroad; Takakkaw Falls, with a free fall of 254 metres; the Natural Bridge, where the Kicking Horse River has carved its way through solid rock and Emerald Lake, famed for its jadecoloured waters.
- Walcott Quarry & Stephen Fossil beds Hike Parks
   Canada Heritage Interpreters lead seven hikes weekly

#### **GLACIER NATIONAL PARK**

A century ago, the diverse landscape of this region was an awesome challenge for the builders of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Today it offers visitors a unique mixture of ice and mountain, beauty and challenge.

- Rogers Pass, site of the largest controlled avalanche area in North America, has been designated a National Historic Site to commemorate the history of this national transportation corridor.
- Hiking Trails Because half of this park is above treeline, visitors can hike almost any of the many trails and experience alpine tundra where, for a few weeks in summer, the meadows burst into a sea of flowers.







#### MOUNT REVELSTOKE NATIONAL PARK

Located right next door to Revelstoke, Mount Revelstoke National Park is a place of incredible contrasts. The 260 square kilometre (100 sq mi) park is known for its spectacular subalpine wildflower meadows and rugged peaks.

- Meadows in the Sky Parkway The peak of Mount Revelstoke can be reached by travelling this 26 km (16 mi) parkway, which takes you through a dense rain forest of cedar and pine, subalpine forest and meadows.
- Nature Trails Along the TransCanada Highway, the Giant Cedars and Skunk Cabbage Trails offer the chance to experience the parks' lush interior rain forests and beautiful wetlands.

#### **KOOTENAY NATIONAL PARK**

Set in the Rocky Mountains of southeastern British Columbia, Kootenay National Park is a 1,406 square kilometre (543 sq mi) land of startling contrasts. Kootenay National Park is an area of incredible scenery and abundant wildlife.

- Marble Canyon a steep and fascinating self-guided nature trail that crosses a narrow gorge eroded by the waters of Tokumm Creek. A connector trail from Marble Canyon leads 3.2 km the Paint Pots.
- Stanley Glacier Hike Parks Canada Heritage Interpreters lead three weekly guided hikes to this recently discovered fossil site. 1-877-737-3783 www.pc.gc.ca www.Reservations.ParksCanada.gc.ca

#### **ELK LAKES PARK**

North of Elkford and nestled in the front ranges of the Rocky Mountains.

- A delicate sub-alpine area of outstanding landscapes, natural lakes and remnant glaciers
- The park offers hiking trails, wildlife viewing and backcountry camping.

#### **GOAT RANGE PARK**

In the Selkirk Mountains near Kaslo along Highway 31.

- This 78,947 hectare park is a large protected wilderness area critical in maintaining the natural habitat for species such as grizzly bear, mountain goat & woodland caribou.
- There is a rustic vehicle access camping area at Gerrard.

#### MCDONALD CREEK PARK

Highway 6, 10 km south of Nakusp on Arrow Lake.

- A holiday destination for swimming, boating & fishing.
- This park features several kilometres of sandy beach, waterfront sites and open grassy meadows.


#### MOYIE LAKE PARK South of Cranbrook

- Day use area, boat launch and 111 site campground and public access to Moyie Lake.
- Swimming, windsurfing, sailing, boating, wildlife and bird watching & a variety of fishing experiences enhance this park.

#### **FORDING MOUNTAIN** (SULPHUR) WARM SPRINGS

• Sulphur Springs is a naturally, warm spring hidden in forest and known for its smell as much as the healing properties some believe the water has. Tricky to find; take the Line Creek Road.

#### HALFWAY RIVER HOT SPRINGS

• Access to these hot springs can be a challenge - found off a steep trail that starts at the end of an old road that branches off the Halfway River Road. The main pool is a wooden structure about 2 metres (6 ft) wide and 1 metre deep.

#### **LUSSIER HOT SPRINGS**

#### Whiteswan Lake Provincial Park

• These popular wilderness hot springs are easily accessed down a wooden stairway. There are several pools among boulders next to the Lussier River.





# **GOLDEN**

#### KICKING HORSE COUNTRY

Surrounded by national parks, three mountain ranges and at the confluence of two historic rivers, there's no wonder the town of Golden is renowned for outdoor recreation. Just about everything is offered – mountain biking, kayaking, whitewater rafting, sky diving, para-gliding... There's also an abundance of wildlife, scenery, history and real-life characters of this mountain town to captivate you and keep you coming back.

#### THINGS TO SEE & DO IN GOLDEN

#### 1. Arts, Culture & Heritage

Enjoy the vibrant cultural scene... the town of Golden is blessed with an abundance of artisan studios and galleries. Pick up a self-guided brochure at the Visitor Centre explore along the Heritage Walking Tour.

#### **2.** Eagle's Eye Restaurant

Canada's most elevated dining experience – take the gondola to the top of the mountain and turn lunchtime into an adventure.

#### 3. Farmers & Artisan Markets

Wednesdays & Saturdays during the summer. You'll find homemade pies and samosas, artisan wares, locally grown produce, woodwork and exotic plants, live music and more.

#### 4. Kicking Horse Pedestrian Bridge

The longest free-standing timberframe bridge in Canada. During the summer, free Summer Kicks Music Concerts take place on selected evenings.

#### 5. 100 km (60 mi) of mountain biking trails

Plus lift-serviced biking and hiking at Kicking Horse Mountain Resort – Trail Maps available at Visitor Centres.

#### 6. Rafting & Kayaking

The Kicking Horse River is world-class and renowned as the Whitewater Gem of the Canadian Rockies. Choose from action packed adventure trips to relaxing interpretive floats.

#### 7. Wildlife viewing

The Columbia Valley Wetlands, Reflection Lake, Edelweiss Slough and Moberly Slough are favourite birding spots. And the Grizzly Bear Refuge offers Interpretive Tours and guaranteed sightings!

#### 8. World's Largest Paddle

Certified by the Guinness World Records, the paddle is scaled up to over 60 feet – perfect for a 78 foot giant! Check it out in Parson, just south of Golden at the Columbia Wetlands Adventures property.


#### 9. Yoho National Park

#### **FIND YOUR PEACE**

The Village of Radium Hot Springs lies at the southern entrance to Kootenay National Park. The hot pool facilities are located in Sinclair Canyon, just a couple of minutes inside the park boundary. People come here not only for the hot springs but also for the excellent golf courses in the area. Radium Hot Springs also offers many hiking opportunities, whitewater rafting adventures and scenic floats. Major events for the village include Wings Over the Rockies (May 4-10), the Classic Car Show (Sept 19) and Music & Market on Main, Friday and Saturdays during the summer.

# THINGS TO SEE & DO IN RADIUM HOT SPRINGS

1. Chainsaw Sculptures by Rolf.

The home of a thousand faces; many of Rolf's sculptures are done by a unique carving toll – the chainsaw.

2. Columbia Valley Wetlands

Marshes adjacent to the Columbia River between Golden and Invermere form one of the largest contiguous wetlands in North America..

3. Cultures in Contact

Culture & history of Ktunaxa Nation & Anatomy of Land exhibit is offered at the Visitor Centre.

**4.** Extensive range of visitor services year-round a variety of restaurants, shops and accommodation from campgrounds to full-service resorts.

#### 5. Gateway to Kootenay National Park

The Highway 93/95 junction is the southern entrance to Kootenay National Park offering several points of interest.

6. Mountain Biking Trails

This area is home to some great cycling: Old Coach Trail, Sinclair Creek & Steamboat Mountain Trails, Nipika Cross River Canyon Trails (See ad page 12). A number of biking events also take place such as the Kootenay Krusher – Saturday, June 6.

7. Nearby Bugaboo Provincial Park

Situated in the Purcell Mountains, this park continues to draw climbers from around the world to its airy, glacier-sculpted granite spires.

8. Rocky Mountain Bighorn Sheep & Headbanger Tours


A famous attraction for Radium Hot Springs – tours take place in the Fall during the sheep's head banging activities.

# INVERMERE ON THE LAKE & PANORAMA MOUNTAIN RESORT

#### **COLUMBIA VALLEY**

Invermere on the Lake is a small, friendly town situated on the shores of one of the warmest lakes in the region. Spend the day at the beach or on the water, but take time to explore the quaint shops and galleries in town. Minutes west of Invermere, also connected by daily shuttle in July and August, Panorama Mountain Resort is all about play. Kids will love the waterpark, waterslide and adventure camps. Grown-ups will enjoy the hot pools, shops, restaurants, the Greywolf golf course & the perfect setting.

#### THINGS TO SEE & DO

#### **1.** A hands-on look at History

The Windermere Valley Museum consists of 10 buildings furnished with pioneer artifacts.

#### 2. Browse the many Artisan Studios & Galleries.

Downtown & on the mountain and throughout the Columbia Valley – Check out local artist studios for pottery and wood design at the Artisan Corner in Windermere.

#### 3. Family packages and Value lodging

Great vacation packages are offered at both Panorama Mountain Resort and downtown properties.

#### 4. Foodies

Tour Kicking Horse Coffee, Arrowhead Brewery or the Farmers Market Saturday mornings downtown during July & August. Fairmont Hot Springs Resort hosts the East Kootenay Wine Festival every November.

#### 5. Greywolf Golf Course

A world-class property located high in the alpine at Panorama Mountain Resort; it serves up one of the finest mountain golf experiences.

#### 6. Hiking & Mountain Biking

Panorama Bike Park offers chairlift accessed hiking & biking, terrain for all abilities and top-line bike rentals. Invermere showcases Swansea Mountain — its upper flanks are steep and rocky, making for some burly riding off the top. The views down the valley are incredible.

#### 7. Lake Windermere

A beach and boating haven – kayak, sail, waterski, swim, play – this area is a magnet for the sun crowd. Watersports rentals and excursions available.

#### 8. Lakeside Event

Watch hangglider and paraglider pilots soar through the air and attempt their water-landing contest. An excellent spectator sport – takes place on August 8 at James Chabot Park.

#### **9.** Learn the history of Explorer David Thompson


He first visited this area in 1807. A beautiful monument is set at Invermere's Pothole Park.

#### **10.** Pynelogs Cultural Centre

This heritage building hosts exhibits, concerts, gallery shows and workshops.

At the south end of Columbia Lake, in the community of Canal Flats, this park has a boat launch, picnic area and beautiful public beach.

Every September, Come for a fun-filled day of entertainment: market, kids zone of games and activities, great food and displays from local interest groups & artisans.

### **KIMBERLEY** A GOOD PLACE TO BE

The city of Kimberley is set in an exquisite location on the western slope of the valley. This former mining town 6. Marysville Falls & Eco Park has recreated itself as a tourism destination, complete with championship golf courses, ski resort and an underground railway that takes visitors into the Sullivan Mine. Kimberley also includes one of Canada's largest 7. municipal Nature Parks - almost 2,000 acres of hiking and mountain biking trails! You'll also enjoy downtown Kimberley, The Platzl, it's an outdoor pedestrian mall with many restaurants and shops.

#### THINGS TO SEE & DO IN KIMBERLEY

1. Canada's largest free-standing Cuckoo Clock is in the Platzl

Put a coin in and out comes Happy Hans.

#### 2. Cominco Gardens

Enjoy the pathways, seating area and acres of gardens filled with thousands of colourful blossoms and giant larch trees.

#### 3. Farmers Market

It's time for fresh food from local farms and food producers, plus crafts from local artisans – downtown, Thursdays, 5-7:30pm.

#### **4.** Fine Food

Kimberley boasts a great selection of dining options from Japanese and German restaurants, to a Wood-fired Pizzeria and Craft Brew Pub.

#### **5.** First Saturdays Events

From May to October, all day Arts & Culture celebrations take place on the first Saturday of each month.

Lovely boardwalk along Mark Creek to the falls. The Park displays a Westslope Trout sculpture celebrating the return of this fish species to the creek.

#### Nature Park

An extensive network of trails criss-cross a natural forested landscape - Maps available at the Visitor Centre.

#### 8. NorthStar Rails to Trails

The former railway between Kimberley and Cranbrook has been converted into a paved 25 km (15mi) multi-use trail – now a part of the TransCanada Trail.

**9.** Overnighting choices range from on-mountain

Condos and vacation homes to downtown hotels and the beautiful Riverside Campground. See ad pg 28

#### **10.** Underground Mining Railway

Explore Kimberley's amazing mining history; the railway will whisk you through the Mark Creek Valley – fun for the whole family. See ad pg 28




















#### THINGS TO SEE & DO IN CRANBROOK

#### 3. Farmers Market

Late-June until early-October, downtown Saturdays 10am-1pm. You'll find vendors offering fresh product, food products, baked goods, handcrafted body care, jewellery and more.

#### **4.** Fort Steele Heritage Town

Once a thriving frontier town, explore this wonderful family attraction – events, demonstrations, steam train rides, gold panning, and more.

#### 5. Kootenay Trout Hatchery

30 km (18 mi) SE of Cranbrook - 3 million baby trout are reared here to enhance recreational fishing opportunities. An extensive interpretive area is featured with aquaria and educational displays.

#### **6.** Ktunaxa Interpretive Centre

Have a first-hand look into the life of the Ktunaxa (pronounced k-too-nah-ha) people. Open by appointment; located in the St. Eugene Resort.

#### **7.** Major Events

Sam Steele Days-community event- 3rd weekend in June, Pro Rodeo - 3rd weekend in August, Grand Fondo (road cycling) - September xx and Six in the Stix -(mountain biking) - September 19.

#### 8. Outdoor Recreation

Cranbrook Community Forest offers interpretive nature trails and birding opportunities. Elizabeth Lake Wildlife Sanctuary – pick up a self-guided tour map at the Visitor Centre. TransCanada Trail includes Isadore Canyon, Rotary Way and the NorthStar Rails to Trails – the former railway between Cranbrook and Kimberley.

#### 9. Recreational Complex

The Western Financial Place is home to the WHL Kootenay Ice Hockey Team, an Aquatic Centre and next to the Skatepark.

#### **10.** Trains Deluxe



#### 8. Visit Artisans of Crawford Bay

Home to a diverse group of craftspeople, most of which are a few minutes walk from each other. Crawford Bay (population 400) also has accommodation, Kokanee Springs Golf Resort, hiking trails and sandy beach.

#### 9. Gray Creek Sailing Regatta

Gray Creek was settled in 1906 and features Kootenay Lake's oldest general store. The Sailing Regatta takes place in the bay, during the first weekend in September (Labour Day) – a fun event for participants & spectators.


#### 10. Riondel Museum

Those unique qualities are matched with world-class outdoor adventure, great dining, shopping & accommodation options.

The Kootenay Lake ferry travels between Balfour and Kootenay Bay – it's a spectacular 35-minute free ride. Allow yourself some extra time to browse the shops and eateries at the Balfour Ferry Landing.

#### 1. Ainsworth Hot Springs

Have a soothing soak in the famous hot springs pools which includes a horseshoe-shaped cave that used to be a mining tunnel. A full-service resort – see ad page:



Live musical theatre shows, highlighting the rich gold mining history of Rossland - held in the restored 1898 Miners Hall.

#### 2. Heritage Walking Tour

Pick up a tour map at the Visitor Centre and discover 30 heritage stone, brick or granite downtown buildings built before 1929.

#### 3. Mountain Market

Every Thursday evening, all summer long – everything handmade and grown locally.

#### 4. The Rossland Historical Museum

# **CASTLEGAR**

#### **CONFLUENCE OF RIVERS AND CULTURES**

Situated at the confluence of the Kootenay and Columbia rivers. Although primarily an industrial town, Castlegar has a strong historical connection to the Doukhobors, a pacifist religious sect that fled Russia in the early 20th century to make a new life in Canada. Learn more about their culture at the Doukhobor Discovery Centre, Zuckerberg Island Heritage Park and Station Museum.

#### THINGS TO SEE & DO IN CASTLEGAR

#### 1. Brilliant Suspension Bridge

Take a walk or ride your bike to explore the network of riverside trails that link the recently restored Brilliant Bridge (a national historic site: built in 1913) with nature reserves and wetlands on both sides of the Columbia.

#### 2. Columbia & Western Rail Trail

The former railway from Castlegar to Midway has been converted into a multi-use trail.

#### 3. Doukhobor Discovery Centre

A reconstructed communal village which includes a collection of handmade furniture, tools and clothing.

#### **4.** Kootenay Gallery of Art & History

The gallery has rotating exhibitions featuring established Canadian and International artists.

#### 5. Sculpture Walk

Castlegar received the Sculpture Capital of Canada designation in 2014. Thirty sculptures from talented artists across North America are installed within downtown. A must see!



#### 6. Station Museum

Originally the Castleaar Rail Station (100 years old): tour the refurbished caboose and view the 1929 Harley Davidson motorcycle.

#### **7.** Summer-long Events

Art Walk, Concerts in the Park – Wednesday evenings in Kinnaird Park and Farmers Market - Saturday mornings at the Museum.

#### **8.** Zuckerberg Island Heritage Park

Thousands of years ago, the Lakes Salish people built winter pit houses here. Sixty years ago, Alexander Zuckerberg built his unique Russian Orthodox Chapel House.

# **SLOCAN VALLEY**

#### SANDON, SILVERTON, NEW DENVER

Unquestionably, the 'Slivery Slocan' is one of the most interesting places to explore in the Kootenay Rockies. With amazing ghost towns, pristine lakes and waterfalls, spectacular mountain vistas and a poignant history with WWII Japanese internment camps, there is a wide range of paths to travel. The many towns and villages such as New Denver, Silverton, Slocan, Winlaw and more – offer a glimpse into the mining past of this valley.

#### THINGS TO SEE & DO IN THE SLOCAN VALLEY

#### 1. Sandon

Once the capital of the Silvery Slocan in the 1890s when Canada's richest silver mining community grew to a population of 5,000. Today, a major heritage ghost town attraction with CPR Steam Train exhibit, Historic Generating Station, Prospector's Pick General Store, Sandon Museum and more.

#### 2. Idaho Peak

A wonderful easy hike showcasing wildflowers, old fire lookout and great views of Valhalla Mountains and Slocan Lake. Trailhead at Sandon.

#### 3. New Denver

Nikkei Internment Memorial Centre – The only interpretive centre in Canada dedicated to the history and internment of over 22,000 Canadians of Japanese heritage.



#### 4. New Denver – Silvery Slocan Museum

A two storey heritage building, originally a branch of the Bank of Montreal. Showcases many exhibits, records, artifacts and photographs of Slocan Lake area.

#### 5. Valhalla Provincial Park

Touted around the world for it rugged and remote beauty, it encompasses 30 km (19 mi) along the west shore of Slocan Lake.

#### 6. Silverton Gallery

Originally built as a schoolhouse in the 1900s, today houses an art gallery and a performance area for live musical events. This property also includes an Interpretive Centre, Outdoor Mining Museum and the Fingland Cabin, across the street.

#### **7.** Historical Trails

This area features some outstanding biking and hiking trails: Kaslo & Slocan Railway Loop, Slocan Valley Rail Trail and the Galena Trail which includes a cable car ride over Carpenter Creek.

#### 8. Arts & Culture

Explore the communities along Highway 6 – you'll find many quaint artisan studios and gift shops.

#### 3. Kuskanax Creek Footbridge

A covered bridge with seating and glass viewing panels spans the Kuskanax. On a hot day, it's a great place to spend some time.

#### 4. Leland Hotel

The oldest continuously operating hotel in British Columbia. Located downtown along with many shops and restaurants.

#### 5. Mountain Biking

Pick up a Trail Map at the Visitor Centre. Trails range from gentle to adrenaline-inducing.

#### **6.** Summer-long Events

Art Walk. Farmers Market, Saturday mornings downtown.

Music in the Park, free concerts on Wednesday evenings at the Community Park gazebo.

#### 7. Nakusp Museum

Over 5,000 artifacts, display of Sinixt stone tools and a replica of the sturgeon-nose canoe.

#### 8. Valkyr Adventures

#### **REVELSTOKE**

#### **CLOSE TO HEAVEN, DOWN TO EARTH**

Revelstoke is all about the mountains – big, beautiful, wilderness loaded mountains. Deep below the peaks of the Selkirk and Monashee mountain ranges, the city is a hot spot for backcountry adventure, the gateway to Mt. Revelstoke and Glacier National Parks and owes its existence to the railway. The picturesque downtown has retained many of its original early 20th century business buildings and hundreds of its heritage homes. The Railway Museum is one of the top attractions, many more are offered in town and a short drive west on Highway #1.

#### THINGS TO SEE & DO IN REVELSTOKE

#### 1. Biking & Hiking

Not far from the downtown core of funky cafes and charming old homes, a splendour of trails awaits adventure cyclists. Two of the most notable trails are Keystone-Standard Basin and Sale Mountain.

#### 2. Canyon Hot Springs

The resort offers a natural mineral hot pool and a swimming pool. Open all summer until late-September.

#### 3. Enchanted Forest & Skytrek Adventure Park

An outstanding family attraction – jungle gym, climbing wall, adventure tower, BC's tallest tree, paddle boats – something for the young, young at heart and adventurous. See ad pg 51.

#### **4.** Heritage Downtown

Pick up a Walking Tour Map at the Visitor Centre and explore Revelstoke's downtown. There's also a Heritage Trail featuring interpretive panels and scenic views, near Centennial Park.

#### 5. Museums

There's many to pick from: BC Interior Forestry Museum, Firehall Museum, Nickelodeon Museum, Railway Museum, Revelstoke Museum and Rogers Pass National Historic Site.

#### 6. National Parks

Glacier Park showcases over 400 glaciers, boardwalks and historic trails. Mt. Revelstoke features lush forests, historic ski jump and Meadows in the Sky Parkway. See Ntl Parks, pg 12.

#### **7.** Railway Day

An event which celebrates Railway history in Canada. Takes place mid-September.

#### 8. Summer-long Events

Farmers Market, Saturday mornings in the downtown Grizzly Plaza. Summer Street Festival, nightly entertainment in the Grizzly Plaza. Heritage Explorers, Tuesdays and Thursdays at the Revelstoke Museum – a kids educational program.

#### 9. Take the TransCanada Highway westbound

to find the Three Valley Chateau, The Enchanted Forest, SkyTrek Adventure Park, Crazy Creek Waterfalls & Suspension Bridge and Beardale Miniatureland. The small settlement of Craigellachie is a historic site, famous for the point where the last spike on Canada's first trans-continental railway was driven, joining the part from the west.


#### 10. More Attractions:




