Kootenay Rockies Region – May Update



- As the tourism industry navigates recovery from the COVID-19 global pandemic, the British Columbia Regional Tourism Secretariat (BCRTS) continues to provide baseline research to support the industry as it moves forward
- Baseline visitor analysis will help industry understand who is visiting our regions so they can plan strategically how and what visitors to attract
- Research commenced with the BC Market as the top priority followed by the Alberta Market
- This report focuses on visitor analysis to Kootenay Rockies Region



# Research Overview




- Environics Analytics is a Canadian based research firm providing information solutions for a variety of industries in both the Canadian and USA Markets
- Visitor View Canada provides insights the tourism industry needs to understand, market and grow their business with Canadian travellers
- Visitor View produces neighbourhood-level estimates of overnight Canadian visitors to Canada, the provinces and territories, or one of Canada's 85 tourism regions as defined by Destination Canada
- Estimates are provided for the total number of visitors, the number of trips and the number of nights spent in each province or tourism region
- Visitor View is based on anonymized, consent-based mobile location data. Monthly, quarterly and annual estimate data is available starting with January 2020 to allow for analysis of historical trends

## Methodology

- **Visitor:** A visitor is defined as someone who travels 60+km from their point of origin
- Trips: Are defined as the count of domestic traveller trips which involved spending one or more nights over the time period as part of a continuous visit to the destination
- Nights Stayed: Is defined as the count of unique nights a domestic visitor was observed in the destination over the time period (between 6:00pm – 8:00am the following day)

# Research Overview

- Visitor View can help you measure the effectiveness of your marketing strategies to Canadian Visitors, as well as understand the Canadian travel and tourism industry and the impact of the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic as it relates to Visitors, Number of Trips and Number of Overnight Stays within Canada, its provinces, territories, and tourism regions
- Using Visitor View, we can compare the number of visitors and their travel patterns in 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023
- We can also compare different regions to assess the impact of the pandemic on Canadian travel patterns and the path to recovery
- Visitor View also allows us to identify the best regions and neighbourhoods in Canada to prospect for new visitors and use the PRIZM Segmentation System to optimize experience development and marketing



During Q1 2020 Kootenay
Rockies saw an average of
418,300 Domestic Visitors.
During Q1 2021 the region
saw 342,600 Domestic
Visitors, in Q1 2022, 456,100
Domestic Visitors and in Q1
2023, 505,600 Domestic
Visitors.

- Increase of 21% 2023 compared to 2020
- Increase of 48% 2023 compared to 2021
- Increase of 11% 2023 compared to 2022

## Canadian Visitors Travelling to Kootenay Rockies by Month


- January 2023 saw a 3% increase compared to 2020, a 48% increase compared to 2021 and a 21% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 3% increase compared to 2020, a 51% increase compared to 2021 and a 9% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 58% increase compared to 2020, a 25% increase compared to 2021 and a -1% decrease compared to 2022

## **Canadian Trips To Kootenay Rockies By Month**


- January 2023 saw a 2% increase compared to 2020, a 43% increase compared to 2021 and a 18% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 5% increase compared to 2020, a 51% increase compared to 2021 and a 10% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 58% increase compared to 2020, a 27% increase compared to 2021 and a 0.4% increase compared to 2022



# **Canadian Visitation**

## Canadian Overnight Stays In Kootenay Rockies By Month

- January 2023 saw a 13% increase compared to 2020, a 48% increase compared to 2021 and a 18% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 12% increase compared to 2020, a 54% increase compared to 2021 and a 9% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 58% increase compared to 2020, a 28% increase compared to 2021 and a 0.4% increase compared to 2022





# **British Columbian Visitation**

**BC Visitors Travelling To Kootenay Rockies By Month** 

- January 2023 saw a 3% increase compared to 2020, a 77% increase compared to 2021 and a 30% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 0.1% increase compared to 2020, a 81% increase compared to 2021 and a 9% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 40% increase compared to 2020, a 46% increase compared to 2021 and a -3% decrease compared to 2022




# **British Columbian Visitation**

## **BC Trips To Kootenay Rockies By Month**



- January 2023 saw a 1% increase compared to 2020, a 68% increase compared to 2021 and a 23% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 3% decrease compared to 2020, a 82% increase compared to 2021 and a 10% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 42% increase compared to 2020, a 45% increase compared to 2021 and a -2% decrease compared to 2022





- January 2023 saw a 3% increase compared to 2020, a 64% increase compared to 2021 and a 24% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 9% increase compared to 2020, a 81% increase compared to 2021 and a 9% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 44% increase compared to 2020, a 41% increase compared to 2021 and a -2% decrease compared to 2022











### Canadian Visitors to Kootenay Rockies February 2020-2023











# Alberta Visitation

## Alberta Visitors Travelling To Kootenay Rockies By Month



- January 2023 saw a 1% increase compared to 2020, a 27% increase compared to 2021 and a 24% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 1% increase compared to 2020, a 24% increase compared to 2021 and a 15% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 65% increase compared to 2020, a -2% decrease compared to 2021 and a 0.1% increase compared to 2026



# Alberta Visitation

## Alberta Trips to Kootenay Rockies By Month



- January 2023 saw a 1% increase compared to 2020, a 24% increase compared to 2021 and a 20% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 3% increase compared to 2020, a 25% increase compared to 2021 and a 16% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 67% increase compared to 2020, a 2% increase compared to 2021 and a 3% increase compared to 2022




# Alberta Visitation

## Alberta Overnight Stays In Kootenay Rockies By Month



- January 2023 saw a 18% increase compared to 2020, a 29% increase compared to 2021 and a 25% increase compared to 2022
- February 2023 saw a 13% increase compared to 2020, a 25% increase compared to 2021 and a 19% increase compared to 2022
- March 2023 saw a 65% increase compared to 2020, a 0.4% increase compared to 2021 and a 6% increase compared to 2022






### Percentage of Visitors to Kootenay Rockies by Province January 2023




### **Canadian Visitors to Kootenay Rockies** January 2020-2023








## Percentage of Visitors to Kootenay Rockies by Province February 2023










